11c. MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND DATES:

There have been no major alterations to the exterior of this house.

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SITE:

This house is situated on the north side of Fifth Street in a row of nineteenth and twentieth-century residential structures. These structures demonstrate the wide range of styles available during that time. The structures are varied in their setback from the street. This house is closer to the street due to the garage bay that extends towards the street.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE:

This house is an excellent example of the Ranch Style that appeared in the late 1930's and continues in popularity today. This structure may be called "rambling" as evidenced in the long one story facade and the projecting garage. Its massing is asymetrical and side gabled with a low sloping roof.

The house is sided in wood tounge and groove siding. Its front facade is dominated by a picture window. Decorative shutter adorn the windows and even the garage. The entire foundation is made of concrete.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This house is constructed on the southern third of Lot #12 of Block 52, as laid out in the 1855 Brewer and Canfield map of Corning. This property changed many hands and was one of the last properties to be developed on the block. In 1950 the property was bought by Paul T and Elanor Clark. Paul was a plant manager at the Fullbrook branch of Corning Glass Works. He is first listed at this address in 1952. Paul would later become the plant manager at Pressware.
