11c. MAJOR ALTERATIONS AND DATES:

A 8' x 16' kitchen addition was added to the rear (south) of the house in 1977. No other major alterations are known.

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDINGS AND SURROUNDINGS:

Situated on the south side of West Fifth Street between Walnut and Chestnut streets, this house is one of several Queen Anne Style structures on the street. The house is more recent than the surrounding houses. The spacing between this house and the neighboring houses is comparatively very small; the setback is consistent.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE:

This one-and-a-half-story house was built in the Queen Anne Style of architecture. The house, which A Field Guide to American Houses would refer to as a "Free Classic" example of the style, exhibits features of the style such as a steeply-pitched roof, a full-width porch, and classical porch supports. The full-width porch in the front (north) has four round columns rising from the porch rail and a pedimented entry. An open gable with cornice returns dominates the rest of the front facade. The east and west facades each feature a wall dormer with an open gable. A single-story projecting wing with a shed roof is located in the rear (south) of the house.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This house is constructed on the western half of Lot #2 of Block 73, as laid out in the 1855 Brewer and Canfield map of Corning. Harry Beck acquired the property from Andrew Frey in 1908 and had the current house built. Andrew Frey was a butcher and buyer who had a store on 24 West Erie Ave. He lived in the house at 88 West Fifth Street. Harry Beck was also a meat cutter, and worked at 70 West Sixth Street.
