Known This ca. 1860 house has had no noticeable additions other than the addition of wood shutters to the facade and the introduction of dome aluminum soffiting to the eaves. Some wood elements of the porch have also been replaced.

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

This house is set well back from the street as were the earliest structures built in the area. The lot is extensively landscaped with hedges bordering the sidewalk, and is sloped south to north towards the alley which is the northern limit of the lot. Ap & size relative to range bracklings?

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE:

two-story The house at 192 Pine Street has the form of a Gothic Revival Style structure, but does not have the more decorative elements of that style. The house does have large, decoratively corbeled chimneys symmetrically placed at the side gabled roof's peak, The foundation is parged fieldstone, while the house is clad

There is a central projecting gable section with A larger single-story, hipped roof porch placed at its base. Square wood supports on the porch arec ્રિને connected by simple balustrades. The door has a curve-topped transom window <u>કુરાવાદ</u>ાદા and a series of Mat-arched moldings which have been partially concealed by changes to the porch roof. There is another porch at the rear of the house which is ed by a flight of stairs. (Mast?/Wesi?)

The windows on the front facade are four-over-four double-hung sash, the reached by a flight of stairs.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

The earliest recorded owner of this ca. 1860 house at 192 Pine Street was Marvin Olcott. Born in Corning in 1858, he was a Yale graduate who conducted a real estate business on his return to Corning. His father, Alexander Olcott, was a state assemblyman for two terms and lived in <u>Corning</u> until his death in 1887. This house may have been Alexander Olcott's home priginally. The property which originally accompanied the house was over a quarter block in size, and would have been (more appropriately the home of an established businessman. The house was occupied by long-term renters until its sale by the estate of Marvin Olcott in 1944. One of the house's occupants was Benjamin W. Wellington, son of Quincy wned bank.
