On February 23, we visited an exhibit of works by local artist Joyce Snyder hosted by Corning -Painted Post Historical Society at the Patterson Inn. It was an enjoyable evening by candlelight, featuring many Corning-Painted Post area landmarks, public buildings, and homes.

Our program on March 23 was a tour of 15 East Market Street newly renovated by preservation architect Elise Johnson-Schmidt. The building houses a retail shop, Elise's architectural business and an apartment.

We hope you'll join us for our upcoming programs:

April 27 – *The Basics of Herb Growing and Planting* – Sylvia Lewis of Massi's Greenhouse will present a timely program on the creation and care of herb gardens. This program will be held at the First Presbyterian Church, Pentecost room, First Street entrance starting at 7:30 p.m.

May 27 - 30 Glass Fest – SNA is excited to be participating in the inaugural Glass Fest this year! We will have a booth on Market Street to sell glass and neighborhood related items. Our annual CAP (Corning Architectural Preservation) Awards will be granted and recipients of our new "CAPS OFF" Award will be honored. Additionally, we will have presentations including a visual tour of glass making landmarks on Corning's southside. Watch for more details as Glass Fest approaches!

October 19 – *The Blacksmith Shop at the Inn* – Leon Golder will present a visual tour of the project at the Benjamin Patterson Inn located at 59 W. Pulteney Street in Corning. The program will begin at 7:30 p.m. in the exhibit room, accessible by parking in the lot off Flint Avenue and proceeding through the gate to the side porch entrance of the Inn.

November 16 – **Annual meeting** - Watch for details. We will meet at the First Presbyterian Church, Pentecost room, First Street entrance starting at 7:30 p.m.

#### HAWKES FAÇADE RESTORATION

Thanks to private contributions and contributions from the American Cut Glass Association and the Carder Steuben Club and SNA we have nearly reached our goal so that the historic Hawkes signs on Market Street can be restored. The original painted signs on the buildings which house Vitrix Glass and OTB are important historic artifacts, and over the years these signs have faded. They have national and international importance as well as historical significance to Corning. Thomas G. Hawkes owned the largest cutting shop in Corning and produced glass that was known throughout the world. Hawkes glass was used in the White House and given as gifts to queens and other heads of state. When a shortage of high-quality lead blanks became apparent, Hawkes was able to convince Frederick Carder to come to America and co-found Steuben Glass. The production of such high-quality glass – both Steuben and Hawkes - led to Corning's nickname - The Crystal City.

We've identified a qualified artist to complete the restoration

which will take about two weeks. Work can begin upon approval from the City, which requires a code variance. A hearing is scheduled for 5pm Monday, April 19 at City Hall. We hope this project will be completed to coincide with the inaugural GlassFest May 27-30.
