

17. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

This house sets on the north side of East Third Street. It has a slightly deeper setback from the road than do its neighbors to its west, but it shares a similar setback as its neighbors to the east.

18. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING AND SITE:

This lot was acquired by Maureen E. Healy in 1973. The listing for a 121 East Third Street address first appears in the 1974 Corning City Directory.

This small one and a half story house has what Gottfried and Jennings refer to as a "saltbox shape" (*American Vernacular Design*, p.41). They go on to say that "the wood frame saltbox house often has a short roof pitch on the side that faces the street, and a long roof in the back", (p.40). These are traits that definitely apply to this house. This house shows many characteristics of modern construction techniques and materials. The foundation consists of laid up concrete blocks that have been parged. The front facade displays aluminum siding and aluminum shutters and has a slightly projecting bow window. The other three facades are even less ornamented than the front.

20. HISTORICAL AND ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE:

This house was constructed in 1973 and thus has relatively little historical significance. However, the house is well built and maintained, and its newer age and simpler architectural style does not detract significantly from the historical significance of the surrounding neighborhood.
